

### Plan of Care for Urinary Incontinence in Women Aged 65 Years and Older

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*This measure is to be reported for all female patients aged 65 years and older with urinary incontinence — a minimum of **once** per reporting period. This measure is appropriate for use in the ambulatory setting only.*

#### Measure description

Percentage of female patients aged 65 years and older with a diagnosis of urinary incontinence with a documented plan of care<sup>1</sup> for urinary incontinence at least once within 12 months

#### What will you need to report for each female patient aged 65 years and older with urinary incontinence for this measure?

If you select this measure for reporting, you will report:

- Whether or not you documented a plan of care<sup>1</sup> for urinary incontinence

#### What if this process or outcome of care is not appropriate for your patient?

Some measures provide an opportunity for the physician or eligible health professional to document when a process or outcome of care is not appropriate for a given patient (also called performance exclusions). Because this measure is applicable to most if not all patients, there are no allowable performance exclusions.

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<sup>1</sup>Plan of Care — May include behavioral interventions (eg, bladder training, pelvic floor muscle training, prompted voiding), referral to specialist, surgical treatment, reassess at follow-up visit, lifestyle interventions, addressing co-morbid factors, modification or discontinuation of medications contributing to urinary incontinence, or pharmacologic therapy.
